YEAR IN BRIEF

01 Key Achievements

- Integration of water-related strategies, targets, and indicators, and Gender Equality, Disability, and Social Inclusion (GEDSI) considerations into Nepal's NDC 3.0.
- Strengthened voice, agency, and leadership of women's groups in locally led climate adaptation and DRR.
- Generated gender-responsive data and strengthened local capacities for inclusive climate adaptation and DRR actions endorsed by the local government.
- Research in water-resilient subnational climate actions in the federal context of Nepal (based in Lumbini Province)- Journal Article under peer review process.
- Provided technical assistance to revise and update the National LAPA Framework 2019.
- Conducted participatory local integrated risk assessment and locally led adaptation planning and decision-making for the development of local adaptation plan.

- Evidence-based consultations and collaborations with diverse stakeholders are essential for influencing policies and strengthening climate governance.
- Building the capacities of local institutions and women's groups supports more inclusive, GEDSI responsive, and locally led climate actions.
